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# 1. GENERAL

The Bernina Ultraks are annual individual trail running competition which takes place in Pontresina, Switzerland. The Bernina Ultraks offer competitors on four courses the opportunity of a personal challenge and an opportunity to measure their level of performance against other competitors in a unique high-alpin mountain setting. It also allows competitors to take advantage of a venue loaded with emotions and history through one of the four courses proposed.

The Bernina Ultraks are supported by Tourismus Pontresina.

# 2. COURSES

Detailed plans of all courses, as well as profiles, are available on: bernina.ultraks.com

The distances have been measured as precise as possible. However, it is still possible that race watches show small differences in distance and altitude. The tolerance level may be up to 5% which may result in distance differences of up to 2km on the Bernina Gletschermarathon.

All races start and finish at the Congress- and Cultural Center "Rondo", Via Maistra 133, 7504 Pontresina.

# 2.5. Substitution courses

In case weather conditions prevent using the original courses, substitution courses will be offered, if that is possible.

# 2.6. Course and time limit modifications

In case of bad weather, and for safety reasons, the organisers are entitled to stop the race at any time, to adapt the courses and/or checkpoints and/or alter time limits. All such decisions will be issued by the Race Committee.

# 2.7. Signposting/Marking

Signposting and course marking explanations will be sent to all runners shortly before the race in the "Runner's Guide" and presented in the runners briefing.

# 3. ENTRY CONDITIONS

#### 3.1. Participation

The trail race is an individual race event. Runners who participate have to feel healthy, fit and well trained to be able to run the courses within the given time until the closure of the finish.

#### 3.2. Minimum age

The persons fulfilling the following conditions can enter the competition:

"Languard Go Vertical":	Birth year 2006 and older
"Steinbock":	Birth year 2006 and older
"Corvatsch":	Birth year 2003 and older
"BMG":	Birth year 2003 and older

Juniors:

Birth year 2003 to 2006



# 3.2.1 Exceptions

The organisers keep the right to grant exemptions.

# 3.2.2 Parental Authorisation

A written authorization by the parents will be required for runners under 18 years of age. The form can be downloaded on our website and must be filled, signed and presented to collect the bib.

# 5.1. Entry fees (per 1st January, 2022)

## 5.2. Phases of registration

Registration during the "Early Bird", "Regular" and "Late Kick in" phases can only be done online. The "Pay n' Run" registration will only take place on site, namely on 01.07. from 03:00 -08:00 pm and on 02.07. from 06:30 am until 30 minutes before the race start. The organizer reserves the right, due to special hygiene regulations, to no longer carry out registration on site.

Please note that all registrations made after Friday, June 24, 2022 (23:00) will not have the runner's name on the race number.

Due to the special situation caused by the Corona pandemic, the organizer guarantees the following: should the Bernina Ultraks be cancelled before 15/04/2022, all registered paying participants will have the following options:



- a.) Granting of a 90% voucher for the 2022 event.
- b.) Refund of the paid participation fee minus the transaction costs (credit card fee, bank charges etc.)

#### 5.3. Limitation in participation numbers

The organisers will retain the right to limit the number of runners per course or overall. A limitation will be announced on the event website.

#### 5.4. Course change / no show

#### 5.4.1. Course change

A participant can change the course until Friday June 24, 2022 (23:00, 11pm). A change of course will result in an extra payment of the difference between the original entry fee and the fee at the time of change. No refund will be made, should the entry fee of the new course be lower than the fee originally paid.

#### 5.4.2. No Show

The entry fee will not be refunded in case a registered competitor does not participate for any reason.

#### 5.4.3 Insurance

An optional insurance can be booked during the online registration.

#### 5.4.4 Race Cancellation

The entry fee will be refunded if the event is cancelled by the organisers for reasons, other than safety or force majeure.

The entry fee will not be refunded for cancellation due to safety or force majeure. No refund of the entry fee will apply in case of cancellation, modification of course or interruption of the competition for safety reasons (particularly bad weather) or force majeure.



# 5.5. Benefits

Each competitor will receive the following benefits:

- A starting number
- An electronic chip for timing
- Aid stations supplies during and after the race
- Finisher shirt

Anything not expressly mentioned here above is to be organised and borne by the competitors, including transportation, accommodation, food and beverage.

# 6. EQUIPMENT

#### 6.1. Compulsory Equipment

For all courses:

• Cell phone with saved emergency number: +41 79 687 4131

On the Corvatsch course you must also carry

Rescue Blanket

On the course of the Bernina Glacier Marathon you have to carry:

- Spikes for crossing the glacier
- Rescue blanket
- Rain or wind jacket

It is also recommended to wear a long-sleeved shirt.

The organizer reserves the right to prescribe additional mandatory equipment depending on the weather conditions (e.g. rain pants).

The organizer will check the equipment when entering the starting area. Missing compulsory equipment will lead to immediate disqualification.

#### 6.2. Poles

Poles are accepted on all courses.

# 7. COMPETITION RULES

#### 7.1. Timing

The starts of all courses are mass starts. Due to the special hygiene rules, it may be required to organise a "wave start". This is a staggered start with runners grouped.

The individual timing starts when runners cross the starting line.



## 7.2. Wearing the bib

Each competitor must wear the bib number clearly visible (number and sponsor) on the chest, the upper body or on the thigh during the whole race.

The bib number gives access to aid stations, medical support as well as all facilities and services dedicated to competitors (such as left luggage, showers, etc.). In addition, the bib can be used after abandoning the race to use the Mountain railroads free of charge on the way down to Pontresina.

# 7.3. Behaviour on the course

Competitors shall comply with the present Rules & Regulations and follow all instructions of the Race Committee.

It is reminded that:

- Every competitor must observe the signposting/course marking;
- Even in the absence of a specific rule or instruction, competitors will take the appropriate measures required by the circumstances in order to avoid accidents, which may affect them, other competitors, organisers representatives or third parties on the course.
- Competitors have a duty to assist any person in danger or victim of an accident and to inform promptly the Race Committee of any accident by phone or by a course marshal (orange gilet);
- A competitor must give way direction, should he be asked to do so;
- Competitors must respect the environment. No littering on the course;
- Any third party physical assistance is forbidden (pushing, pulling or carry,...).

#### 7.4. Withdrawal, abandoning the race and disqualification

A competitor may decide to withdraw or can be pulled out of the race by the Race Committee.

Except in case of injuries, withdrawal can only take place at a check point. The competitor will have to follow instructions from the Race Committee.

A competitor that does not meet the time limits will be considered as disqualified and needs to follow instructions from the Race Committee.



## 7.5. Time limits and closure of finish

The organisers will keep the right to announce a time limit for all trails. Time limits can also be imposed short term because of weather and natural situations. For the trails currently announced under normal weather situations, time limits only for the Bernina GLetschermarathon and the Go Vertical trail will be announced on or before Feb 1, 2022.

Times for the closure of finish are currently:

Friday, Go Vertical20:00Saturday, all trails19:00

# 7.6. Anti-doping

The organisers requires the integrity of the competitors and the respect of sport ethical rules. Competitors shall refrain from any doping practice. The list of forbidden substances and methods is the WADA list (in competition) in force at the time of the competition (http://www.wada-ama.org/en/).

The organisers reserve the right to conduct anti-doping tests. Competitors accept to submit to such tests.

#### 7.7. Penalties

#### 7.7.1. General

Penalties will be imposed in case of breach of the Rules & Regulations by a competitor. All decisions related to penalties are made by the Race Committee and are final.

## 7.8. Protest

Protest can be made in writing to the Race Committee latest 15 min after a competitor crosses the finish line. Past this deadline, a protest will no longer be admitted.

Protest must be accompanied by a deposit of 100,- CHF that will be refunded if the protest is decided in favour of the applicant. The deposit is not refunded if the protest is rejected.

Decisions related to protests are final.

# 8. **RESULTS AND PRIZE GIVING**

#### 8.1. Results

Rankings per category will be published on the website <u>https://bernina.ultraks.com/en/</u> after the results are made final.

In case of discontinuation of the race, ranking will be set according to times at the last check point.

#### 8.2. Prize-giving

A prize-giving ceremony will be organised. Typically, it takes place on Saturday, at 3:30 PM (tbc) for the following categories:

- Men Overall per course ("scratch"), top three
- Women Overall per course ("scratch"), top three
- Juniors Men, top three
- Juniors Women, top three
- Winners of each age categories as per Clause 4
- Winners of the Bündner Classification per course for Women/Men
- Winners of the combined ranking
- Winners of the pair ranking

A change of date and time is subject to weather and organisational influences.



# 9. ORGANISATION AND RACE KOMITEE

#### 9.1. The Organiser

The Bernina Ultraks trail run is organised by PEAKS Park GmbH in Pontresina

#### 9.2. Race Committee

#### 9.2.1. Formation

A Race Committee will be formed by the organisers. It consists out of four persons. Officials, such as guides, doctors, etc. that are present along the course must be considered as representatives of the Race Committee.

#### 9.2.2. **Responsibilities**

- Manage the competition, including changing or stopping the programme/course;
- Enforce the Rules & Regulations ;
- Act as jury in case of protest ;
- Take all decision commanded by the circumstances and that are not expressly covered by the Rules & Regulations

#### **10. LIABILITY AND INSURANCE**

Each competitor must be personally insured against accidents and other damages. Rescue costs in case of accident are not borne by the organisers.

In case of need, the official mountain rescue service will be called to operate rescue operations and make decision regarding the engagement of necessary means, including helicopter. Costs resulting from rescue, including cost of transportation from the location where the person is transported, will be borne by the rescued person. It is the sole responsibility of the competitor to submit a claim in due time to his/her insurance.

In case the organisers have to meet costs of the rescue, such costs will have to be reimbursed to the organisers by the competitor (or his/her insurance).



# 11. LEGAL PROVISIONS

Competitors take part at the Bernina Ultraks under their sole responsibility and at their own risks. Competitors waive any claim or recourse against the organisers, whatever the damage suffered.

In case of accident, any liability of the organisers, its officers, employees, agents, auxiliaries, volunteers is expressly excluded to the full extent permitted by law.

Each competitor expressly allows the organisers, as well as its licensees and co-contractors, such as media and sponsors, to use pictures and films of the competition, including its preparation and follow-up phases, where he/she could appear in the context of his/her participation to the Bernina Ultraks, on any medium, including promotional and/or advertising documents and without limitation in time and space.

Participation to the competition does not confer any rights to use the race for promotional or commercial purposes. Any communication on the competition or use of images of the race is forbidden subject to an express and written authorisation from the organisers.

Bernina Ultraks is a registered trademark.

In case of differences between the different versions of the Rules & Regulations, the German version shall be the prevailing one.
